#### **SWIS Conference Update**

Steve Bailey, Dan Chart, and Bonnie Spindler attended the SWIS –Southern Wisconsin Conference on October 28<sup>th</sup>. We participated in a short 'Fall/Halloween' Ice-Breaker sharing our creativity. We shared with about 50 other Optimists representing about 20 different clubs, being led by Optimist International - OI Regional Great Plains Vice President, Roger Lofeski and Patsy Garner, OI Trainer. Sharing included the results of questions: What is one thing in your club that is positive?; If resources for your club was not an issue, what would you want to do to improve your club? What are the obstacles that have held you back in your club? Amongst other questions. There was also training for new Lt. Governor's and new club President's. 
#### **October Luncheon Activities**
