Respect For Law

Captain Vic Wahl gave an update on the Madison Police Department. MPD has responded to 1.9 million calls for service over the last decade. Over the past year, MPD has added a centralized violent crimes unit and burglary unit to facilitate in solving those types of crimes. They also now have full time mental health officers. The neighborhood resource officers that we learned about last year continue to target emerging problem areas in the city. Captain Wahl also sighted the importance of a new precinct station on the near west side that is currently in the planning stages.
