The meeting was called to order by Mary Schwartz at 7:55 AM. A motion was made by Carole, seconded by Jacci and passed, to approve the minutes of the May 15, 2013 Board Meeting.

Treasurer's Report

Bob asked for questions regarding the May, 2013 financial statements. STOC had an operating cash balance of \$4,268 as of May 31 and Foundation cash balances totaled \$9,262. In addition, the Foundation's Vanguard Bond account had a balance of \$3,694. The Board discussed one outstanding accounts receivable balance. Bob noted that we are completely out of STOC pins and after a few weeks of trying he was finally able to get a quote from Championship Awards. A motion was made by Carole, seconded by Liv and approved to order 100 pins (their minimum order) at a cost of approximately \$370 plus tax. Bob noted that a separate checking account has been set-up solely for JOOI club funds. A motion was made by Carole, seconded by Jacci and passed, to accept the May, 2013 Treasurer's Report.

Membership Report

The next evening happy hour/membership event will be on August 14 and will replace that week's lunch meeting. The social/membership committee (Jacci, Liv, and Tracey) will meet with Mary to discuss plans for this event.

STOC's membership remains at 40 regular members plus 6 FOO's for a total of 46 members. The September 30, 2012 numbers were 41 regular members plus 5 FOO's also for a total of 46.

Speaker Schedule

Mary noted that several club members volunteered to fill speaker slots over the next couple of months and we are in pretty good shape there. No meeting will be held on July 3 due to the Fourth of July holiday. Mary noted that we are now operating under a new summer menu arrangement with the Radisson, but their prices will remain the same.

Honor Club Requirements

Mary reviewed the annual requirements for STOC to be an OI Honor Club this year. The big challenge remaining is to increase our membership and/or start a new club. Carole, Dan and Liv will meet with former JOOI club President, Maggie Radl, in the near future to discuss the possibility of starting a new Optimist club at UW-Madison.

UW-Whitewater Optimist Club trip to Burkina Faso

Carole and Mary reported that the UW-Whitewater Student Club has planned a mission trip to Burkina Faso and will be taking an ambulance filled with computer equipment and other items. In connection with this project, they are asking clubs to provide them with hotel toiletry items.

Mary passed on a report from Bonnie that discussions are being held to determine if the 2nd quarter SWIS Conference (held in February) should be eliminated for the 2013 - 2014 SWIS calendar.

The 4th Monday of the month volunteer program at Reach-A-Child will be held on June 24 followed by a social event (all members and friends are welcome to attend) at Monk's. It was pointed out that Carole has recently become the new Executive Director of Reach-A-Child.
