The bees gave us honey.

Lots and lots of honey.

Half pints to pints and pints to quarts, even gallons of honey from the hive we keep off the southwest corner of our home.

We started harvesting in the early spring as I opened the hive and discovered each of the four boxes each containing ten frames and each frame weighing up to eight pounds filled with honeycomb and honey.

The bees did their job.

Ranging as far as three miles from home, the bees gathered pollen from every variety of blooming plant and flower: roses, creeping Charlie, dandelions, cone flowers, honeysuckle, goldenrod, zinnias and apple blossoms, then returned to the hive which is and of itself a work of art.

They built beautifully constructed six-sided hexagonal cells in which to store their treasure and if you go to the store and price honey, if that's the way you calculate treasure, the bees produced tens and hundreds perhaps even a thousand dollars' worth of honey that now sits as you see pictured golden and tempting on our kitchen cupboard.

Honey.

Sweet, thick, luscious, nutritious, healthful honey, full of mysterious beneficial qualities that make every bite, every taste, gooey slurp or swallow a delight.

The bees gave their lives doing this.

They're gone now.

The hive is empty.

Some have died. Some have simply disappeared. All they left is the honey, the evidence of where they've been and that brings us to ourselves and our role in Optimism.

We have our gueens and our workers; our drones and scouts and we gather together to produce what we may never fully appreciate or utilize for ourselves. Ours is the honey of the community. The sweet cooperation with one another to nurture and benefit the world in which we live.

- 1. Welcome/ Agenda Additions

3. Financial Report-March and April 2023

STOC's cash balance as of 4/30/23 was \$3,223 with \$4,838 in cash equivalents. March and April finance activity was routine. Mark moved to accept the financial report, Mary seconded, and motion passed..

4. Refund Super Optimist Sibs Day funding re: Cap Times Kids Fund/ARC Dane County. Jane reported that she spoke to both organizations, thanking them for their financial support in the past and that the program has been cancelled for 2023 due to low attendance. The STOC Foundation will reimburse both the Capital Times Kids Fund (\$2,200) in May and Jane is still working with the ARC Dane County (\$250).

5. SWIS District Executive Committee Meeting -Report

Reinstatement by SWIS District for JOI Funding to International Convention-at the recent meeting, John proposed to reinstate that policy and it was reinstated in the amount of \$1,200 which will subsidize costs for attendance by the JOI District Gov, JOI Lt Gov, and a JOI advisor at the international convention. To help cover transportation costs for the JOI Lt. Governor who is also an SYS student, Lavinia Vulpul, to reach the July convention in Arlington VA., the STOC Foundation has been asked to contribute \$200. This was tabled for the Foundation meeting to follow.

6. Sauk Trails Scholarship Recipients: congratulations and instructions

John sent congratulatory letters to recipients, including instructions on how to receive the scholarship.

- 7. Respect for Law-May 17: currently, 28 attendees are reserved. Steve Bailey coordinates the program and communications.
- 8. Bratfest-May 25 & 26: Diane Hoebel coordinates Club participation
- 9. Football Crazr Tickets: Bob has offered to handle the selling of tickets. We earn \$10-\$12 per ticket we sell which is normally about 50-60 tickets sold.
- 10. Further Business: none
- 11. Adjournment: Bob moves to adjourn to at 5:49pm, Mark seconded, motion passes unanimously.
