Board Members in Attendance: John Scherer, Bob Wortinger, Kathy Johnson, Carole Klopp, Ray Schmitz, Jacci See, Bonnie Spindler, and Gene Spindler. Other STOC Members Attending: Steve Bailey

Financial Report

The Secretary-Treasurer presented the July financial statements and related reports. The Board discussed the 7/31/11 accounts receivable listing. The Board also discussed the handling of fees for 2011 MASCC Service Club Olympic activities. Following discussion, the Board approved an approach similar to recent years where STOC will pay for the first \$10 of the \$22 SCO dinner fee for each member attending. This discount does not apply to guests.

It was noted that \$100 was paid out to the OI Foundation as a donation in July as approved by the Board earlier in the year. Proceeds were received for the work at the WIAA concession stands in February and March. The Board also discussed if any additional contributions should be considered at this time - following discussion, none were proposed. Board members were asked for any questions regarding the financial reports issued for July. There were no additional comments or questions. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the July Treasurer's Report.

Social Committee

Noted Service Club Olympics and the strong efforts by several members leading to another 1st place finish. The STOC Summer Picnic is scheduled for Sunday, August 28 from 1 - 3 PM. The Mallards game is scheduled for August 11.

Membership Report

Bob reported no changes this month and our membership remains at 30 regular members plus 2 FOO's.

Fundraising Report

It was reported that the Kiss A Pig event has been cancelled for this year as Kevin was unable to find a site for this event. Gene noted that Football Craze tickets are out. This year's Football Craze is based on 8 weeks of college games with 11 prizes per week. STOC should be getting back \$13 - \$14 per ticket sold. He currently has tickets for sale at \$20 per ticket.

Report on Meeting and Visits with West Madison Optimist Club (WMOC)

John led discussion regarding a couple of joint activities held with their club. Following Board discussion on the pros and cons, it was agreed to monitor the next couple of joint meetings and then gather opinions from STOC members as to whether we should continue discussions with WMOC regarding a possible merger.

Reducing/Monitoring the Number of Club Activities.

John led discussion on reducing the number of official STOC activities. Other activities can be done by STOC members through and on behalf of STOC and presented to other club members for assistance, but will not be considered primary STOC activities for presentations to new members, etc.

Following discussion, a motion was made by Kathy, seconded by Carole and passed to approve the above as our current STOC official activities.
