- **2. Board Meeting Minutes:** January 18,2022 minutes Kathie moves to approve with name correction, Carole seconds, motion passes unanimously.
- 3. Financial Reports Tabled to March 2022

4. Meeting Speakers

It was suggested to do it on a Wednesday early evening and have pizza. Steve and Rick are co-chairs. March 23rd is our possible date. Also host the Zone competition April 6th or 13th Wednesday. Verona/Cross Plains/ STOC. Kathie reported that February 16th is the training for running the contest.
- e. JOI Club Update: 2 new secretaries / 158 kids and over 1000 hours of service.

Sauk Trails Optimist Club Board of Directors Meeting March 15, 2022 MINUTES

PRESENT: Rick Thomas, Carole Klopp, Bob Wortinger, Diane Hoebel, Kathie Newman, Rick Conne, and Jane Meyer

ABSENT: Mark Kraemer, Kathy Johnson, Ted See and Steve Bailey

The meeting was called to order via Zoom at 5:06pm.

1. Welcome / No Agenda Additions

Board Meeting Minutes: February 15, 2022 minutes – Kathie moves to approve, Bob seconds, motion passes unanimously.

Financial Reports –

a. <u>STOC Financials</u>: Bob reviewed the February Balance sheet noting that we started the year with \$4000 in operating checking. Current AR includes 7 people owing dues totaling \$840. (Two are 2 quarters behind. Will wait until next quarter to contact.) The February Income Statement showed that the nut proceeds were the best we've ever had. Bob also noted that the SWIS District conference line is at \$465 and having been budgeted at \$700, we will probably see a shortfall of \$300. This will, in all likelihood, be offset by the decrease in the lunch guests budget line of about \$200.

b. <u>Foundation Financials</u>: The Foundation currently has assets of \$16,200. Vanguard has been good in the long term. Gene Spindler memorials came in at \$1,030. The Foundation Board will approve what Bonnie suggests for use. Gene and Ray banner patches have been ordered as approved at last board meeting. Should be here in 6 to 8 weeks. Final NOTE: we already paid out \$2000 for Lussier toys. We expect to have approximately \$7700 available currently for local grants and student scholarships.

c. Membership: We are currently at 42 members after starting the year at 44.

Carole moves to accept the financial report, Jane seconds, passes unanimously.

3. Meeting Speakers:

Tomorrow will be a Trivia St. Patrick's Day Trivia contest. The following Wednesday, we'll have the Oratorical Contest at 5:30pm at Good Shepherd which will take the place of our noon meeting. The following weeks: Sean Spindler, then Rebecca Spindler, then Paul Johnson followed by Mary Schwartz.

4. In-Person Meetings

There has been low attendance, but for the next 3 weeks we will remain hybrid. People should be comfortable.

5. Committees and Activities

- a. <u>Fundraising:</u> Brat Fest: Diane reported Kathie signed us up for Friday evening 5-9:30pm for 5 or 6 members. Rick Thomas is doing Saturday and Sunday grilling from 9 to noon. This year people can sign up themselves as well and can check working for a charity. We will tell the JOI Club.
- b. <u>Social:</u> Vitense Golf: We would get a free golf suite, but would have to buy any food. Would do an evening meeting for this. Rick will work with Diane on this for possibly the end of April or May.
- c. Essay Contest: Winner will attend the March 30th luncheon. (There was only one contestant.) Bob asked about gift cards for Judges \$10 gift card. Discussion followed on how much for Gift card for the students participating in both the Essay & Oratorical contests. Carole moves \$10 gift card for essay judges and \$20 for 1st & 2nd students. Bob seconds. Motion passes unanimously.
- d. Oratorical Contest will be March 23rd at Good Shepherd at 5:30pm with pizza served for dinner.
- e. 2022 Special Olympics: May 15th is the Special Olympics at Oregon HS.
- f. JOI Club Update: Advisers are back in the building. Currently have 168 members and over 1400 hours of service.
- **6. AJOURNMENT**: Kathie moves to adjourn, Diane seconds, motion carries unanimously. We adjourned at 5:31pm to Tuesday, April 19th, 2022 at 5:00 p.m.

MINUTES

Present: Rick Thomas, Bob Wortinger, Carole Klopp, Diane Hoebel, Kathie Newman, Jane Meyer, and Rick Conne

ABSENT: Mark Kraemer, Kathy Johnson, Ted See and Steve Bailey Meeting called to order at 5:37pm on Zoom.

- 1. Welcome/ Agenda Additions none.
- 2. Bob moves to approve minutes of the September 2021 Foundation meeting. Diane seconds, motion passes unanimously.
- 3. <u>Financial Report</u>: Bob reviewed all the financials and indicated we currently expect to have \$7700 available for grants and scholarships (which includes dollars to be brought in the rest of the year). He indicated revenues are down \$2000 due to less received in Happy Dollars and \$1500 due to Vanguard. He also noted that the \$2000 expensed for the Lussier Christmas Party also impacted the fund. Rick Conne noted that he has spoken with the Walmart manager who asked that our grant request be submitted quickly and that we should ask for \$5000. Rick will work on that now. Rick is also looking into fundraising at Culvers. Bob noted that we normally decide grants in September, but need to set the scholarship amounts now, even though we don't know exactly what our financial position will be in September.
- 4. Scholarships: Bob suggested \$1000 per student scholarship. Carole agrees with Bob. Diane asked what we granted last year. Bob said it was a total of \$6000 plus \$4000 in scholarships. However if we can do some fundraisers and get the amount up, we would have more to give. Right now, however, we would have \$3300 for non-profits in September minus the scholarship money. Carole moves to award \$1000 scholarships to seniors totaling no more than up to 4 scholarships for a total of \$4000. Kathie seconded the motion. Discussion ensued. Kathie will be donating \$1000 to foundation for scholarships. Carole indicated she will also be giving money towards scholarships. Motion passed unanimously.
- 5. There being no further business, Jane moves to adjourn, Kathie seconds, motion passes unanimously. We stand adjourned until the call of the chair.
