

Adventures In Optimism: Ken Adi-Ring

On December 13, 2018 eccentricity joined the Sauk Trails Optimist Club. Eccentricity had a name.

Ken Adi-Ring.

The name will endure, although on March 19, 2021, the man passed away.



What does it mean, that word, 'eccentricity'? Altogether it means 'departure from customary conduct."

In the case of Ken it meant a man who nonplused the Sauk Trails membership by identifying himself as a massage practitioner and hypnotherapist, a man conversant with Easter religion, enamored of both Jesus Christ and Buddha, a man for whom words like wellness and meditation were commonplace and devoutly practiced; a man who wore oddly mismatched clothing that always appeared supremely comfortable; a man who sought gentle aspects of life because he had himself been tremendously injured.

An eccentric man.

Born May 17, 1946 and raised in Mazomanie with five brothers, Ken suffered critical burns at the age of nineteen in an automobile accident involving the ruptured fuel tanks of a semi-trailer truck. That's one of the reasons why Ken took particular interest when Sauk Trails Optimists became supporters of the Wisconsin Professional Fire Fighters Association Burn Camp for children

suffering life altering burns and that's why Ken traveled with other Sauk Trails members to the camp near East Troy to view firsthand the children and the benefits of the camp. Ken knew what the children had been through and like the children, he faced the truth fearlessly.

Ken also suffered breast cancer. That's one of the reasons he showed up wearing an outlandish wig with synthetic hair standing straight up nearly a foot over his head the day Sauk Trails Optimists held our noon luncheon at Holy Wisdom Monastery. Ken sought donations for the Susan G. Komen Foundation and handed out information cards.

He never took off the wig.

Another terrible traffic accident left Ken critically injured last year. Numerous broken bones including vertebrae and a punctured lung did not keep Ken from attending Sauk Trails Optimist meetings on line, until the day he requested permission to address the club after doctors treating his traumatic injuries and the worst pain of his life discovered a condition for which no treatment was available or advised.

"I've only got a few weeks to live," Ken stated.

He spoke to his fellow Optimists with calm and composure, an eccentric man facing the end of his life with conformity to his own God given sense of dignity and grace.

The Optimists of Sauk Trails gave him a polo shirt, a certificate and an orchid, delivered to his home. They also gave him what he valued most, Participation; a chance to do good with and for others and join in acts of service to youth.

"He had a real soft spot for kids," said his wife Sally. "He hated to miss a single meeting. He enjoyed it so much."

The place where Ken sat at home is vacant now. Sally had an orange tabby cat before she and Ken married thirty-five years ago. She has another one now. Ken encouraged her to adopt it and the cat is getting used to the dog who sleeps amid images of Buddha and Christ and emblems of tranquility and peace and pictures of natural wonders all around the home.

The Ring Home is quietly eccentric.

There are inspirational images and messages on the calendars Ken had printed for his business, Tri-Unity Wellife Associates. The message for the month of April is 'Confidence' and the image is one of growth and spring time as tender plants push up from fertile soil with the quote, "Have confidence if you have done a little thing well, you can do a bigger thing well too," by English playwright David Storey.

There are over two hundred and fifty days left in this year 2021. The man who had the calendars printed is gone, yet the calendars remain available while supplies last.* Ken would have wanted everyone at Sauk Trails Optimists to have one with His blessing:

"Namaste"

That is not eccentric.

It is the way Ken often greeted us with his hands folded and a slight bow.

It means "Hello".

Editor's Note: On March 7, following the noon Sauk Trails meeting, a visit was made to the home of Ken Adi-Ring where he was presented with a Sauk Trails polo shirt, a living orchid and a framed certificate of recognition for his service as a Sauk Trails Optimist, singed by Optimist International president Mark Weinsoff. Memorial observance for Ken will be held Saturday, July 17 from 1pm to 5pm at Unity of Madison, 601 Tompkins Drive, Madison WI 53716.

MINUTES

ABSENT: Rick C.

- 1. Welcome/Agenda Additions. President Newman called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.
- 2. Approval of 1-12-21 Minutes: Motion by Nancy, seconded by Ken. Passed unanimously.
- 3. January Financial Report: Bob reported that operating net cash position is up about \$1000 from fiscal year start due to pandemic. Rick T. moved to accept the financial report; seconded by John.
- 4. Committees and Activities:
 - a. Progressive Dinner: The Dinner is to be replaced by a game event. Mary asked for feedback from the game day meeting recently. Feedback was positive. Mary suggested March 28 from 3:30-5:00.
 - b. John proposed inviting Oakwood Village residents to visit our meetings via Zoom. Staff at Oakwood is open to the idea; Board agrees. John will coordinate. We will see how many join our meetings and if they are potential members.
 - c. Oratorical Contest Steve reported that he is working with Carole to engage JOOI Club members. Rick T. has a list of students for the Contest. The date for the Contest is March 24's regular meeting, pending Carole's schedule. Judges are Kathy J, Diane, and John. Zone 6 contest will be April 10. May 1 is the super/regional zone contest. Rick T. asked about celebrating the Student of the Month (SOM) again and Kathie will check with Carole about Rick' C.s involvement with SOM. Rick T. will research Festival Foods brat stand in Verona. Kathie will check with Bonnie for the status of the Verona Club.
 - f. Volunteer & Community Activities- Mustard Days, Culver's, Bratfest, etc. All events appear doubtful.

Addition: 1. JOI: Mary said that on May 1, JOI is having a talent competition called Sounds of the Spartan Music Competition, broadcast on Facebook Live to raise money for Angels Wish and the Memorial High School Music Department. Carole asked for a sponsorship donation. Rick motioned a sponsorship of \$100. Rick C. seconded. Passed unanimously.

- 1. CrazR Football Tickets: John will coordinate, and we will request 50 tickets.
- 2.Welcome/Agenda Additions. President Newman called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m.

Addition: We also discussed where we meet in the future and Kathie would like feedback from the members. Steve and Rick C. will check with Denny's. Radisson is currently \$200-\$300 for room and catering in food would be required.

- **3.Approval of 3-9-21 Minutes:** Motion by seconded by Bob and seconded by John. Passed unanimously.
- **4.February Financial Report:** Bob reported: Operating cash is still strong at \$5436. March activity was routine. Motion to accept by Rick C. and seconded by Rick T.
- **5.Memorial Patch for Ken-Adi Ring.** To get one, we need to send a \$100 OI Contribution and Request Form to the OI Foundation. The \$100 contribution counts toward our annual OI Foundation donation. The patch would arrive in about 6 weeks. Note: Shenita Taylor at OI said STOC is at \$9211--the benefactor level. At the \$10,000 level, we would be at the Eminent level of contributions. Mary motioned and John seconded. Approved unanimously.

9. Board positions:

We need the officers of the club, the immediate past president and 6 elected members. By-Laws Article VI, Section 1 asks that an appointee serve the duration of Ken's term, Carole and Mary are working on filling Board positions for 2021-22. Rick C. and Steve continue for one more year, plus replacing Ken's position. Ted, Mary, Nancy's terms are expiring. Ted indicated he'd serve another term. Ken was in the first year of a two-year term which will end September 2022.

Carole proposed a \$100 cash or gift certificate to accompany the award. She will advise names of scholarship winners soon. Motioned by Kathy J. and seconded by Steve; passed unanimously.

Mike G. and Steve asked about it and may be interested in volunteering. Special Olympics also planned a golf outing on 9/12 at the Kestrel Ridge course in Columbus, and a Sun Run & Solar Plunge on June 19 at Schluter Beach in Monona.
- 12. Build Your Own Brat Fest: activity would be in lieu of the Madison Brat Fest at the Alliant Energy Center. The Board discussed and decided not to participate.
- 13. Honor Club Award: based on service projects, membership increased by 3, club growth and community awareness, increased volunteer efforts and new community efforts. Officers have completed the OI LMS training, required by be completed by 3/31/21.

Adjourn to May 11, 2021, motioned by Rick C.; seconded by Mary. Passed unanimously. Adjourned at 5:59
