Sauk Trails Optimist Club – STOC Sprecher's – May 11, 2011 Board Meeting Summary

Board Members in Attendance: John Scherer, Bob Wortinger, Kevin Campos, Kathy Johnson, Ray Schmitz, Darrin Sharp, Bonnie Spindler, and Gene Spindler. Other STOC Members Attending: Mary Schwartz

The minutes of the April 13, 2011, Board Meeting were reviewed and approved with no revisions.

Financial Report

Board members were asked for any questions regarding the financial reports and notes issued for April. There were no comments or questions.

John led discussion regarding investment of STOC's fundraising account. Following discussion, it was agreed that the Secretary-Treasurer should open an account with Vanguard and invest in the Vanguard Short-Term Bond Fund (VBISX). In accordance with a motion passed at an earlier meeting, 75% of funds raised in the previous year plus a \$2,000 buffer should be maintained in checking – this is approximately \$6.150.

Fundraising Report

Kevin provided an update on the Kiss A Pig contest which is planned for August. The profits from this event would be split between MOM, Reach-A-Child, and STOC. Kathy noted that with the cancellation of the fall 2011 basketball/fitness challenge she had sent letters to the three entities which had already donated a total of \$200 requesting permission to use their donations for the Kiss-A-Pig event. Permission was received from one donor with no responses from the other two. It was agreed that unless a direct response was received from the other two, their funds will be retained for this new event. A motion was approved to joint venture with MOM and Reach-A-Child for the Kiss A Pig event.

It was noted that we will be working the same UW concession stand for the 2011 UW football season. Gene pointed out that the Football Craze tickets are out. Due to the potential NFL strike/lockout, this year's Football Craze will be based on 8 weeks of college games with 11 prizes per week. STOC should be getting back \$13 - \$14 per ticket sold.

Service Events Report

Bonnie reported on the schedule for STOC members working at upcoming "Cancer Meals". Carole provided an update on JOOI activities, noting that the annual induction banquet is scheduled for the evening of May 23. John noted that 10 STOC members have signed up so far to work at the Special Olympics track meet on May 14 in Oregon.

Membership Report

Based on a request from Jeff Hosking to resign from STOC, a motion was approved to remove Jeff from the Club roster. With the loss of Jeff, our current membership is at 30 regular members plus 2 FOO's.

Social Committee

Discussion was held on options for the summer picnic including a possible donation to the Vilas Park Zoo and possible arrangements for a joint event with the Downtown, Breakfast or Madison West Optimist clubs. No action was taken pending more information from Allison.

Reducing/Monitoring the Number of Club Activities

John revisited the memorandum he had sent to Board members last month regarding putting enhanced focus on just a few club activities and encouraging significantly more member involvement at these designated activities. Other fundraising and service activities would still be offered if a few club members are interested in continuing their past involvement with them. John agreed to send a survey out to members this month to get input on areas of greatest interest.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 1 at 4:30 PM at Sprecher's.
