From the Progressive Dinner...

Simply Sour Cream Chicken Enchiladas

Prep time: 25 minutes Total time: 45 minutes Servings: 8 Ingredients:

- 1 pound chicken breast, diced
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 8 (8 inch) flour tortillas, softened
- 1 ½ cups grated monterey jack cheese, divided (can substitute Mexican cheese blend)

1/4 cup butter

1/4 cup flour

- 1 (15 ounce) can chicken broth
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 (4 ounce) can chopped green chilies

Directions:

- In frypan, cook chicken and onion together in oil over medium-high heat until chicken is just done.
- 2. Divide cooked chicken evenly between 8 tortillas; add 1 ½ tablespoons chees to each tortilla.
- Roll enchiladas and place seam side down in 9 X 13" baking dish that has been lightly sprayed with no-stick cooking spray.
- Melt butter in a medium saucepan; stir in flour to make a roux; stir and cook until bubbly; gradually whisk in chicken broth, bringing to a boil, stirring frequently.
- 5. Remove from heat; stir in sour cream and green chilies; pour sauce evenly over enchiladas.
- Top with remaining cheese (baking dish may be double-wrapped and frozen at this point) and bake at 400F for 20 minutes until cheese is melted and sauce near edges of baking dish is bubbly.
