Board Meeting Minutes

STOC Regular Board Meeting

First Weber Office - September 12, 2012

The meeting was called to order by Jacci See at 7:45 AM. A motion was made by John, seconded by Carole, and passed, to approve the minutes of the August 10, 2012 Board Meeting.

Treasurer's Report

Bob asked for questions regarding the August, 2012 financial statements which were sent to the Board prior to the meeting. STOC has an operating cash balance of \$2,785 as of August 31 and Foundation cash balances total \$9,524. Bob noted that payouts were made in August to both 2012 scholarship winners. Two STOC members still have receivables outstanding from the April 1 quarter. Dan Bergs agreed to perform the audit committee duties this year. A motion was made by Carole, seconded by Gene and passed to accept the August, 2012 Treasurer's Report.

Membership Report

The Board discussed and reversed a decision related to a membership matter at the August 10, 2012 Board meeting. Also, a motion was made by Carole, seconded by Mary and approved to accept Mike Grasmick's application to join STOC. This leaves our membership count at 32 + 2 FOOs for a total of 34. STOC started this fiscal year at 30 members (29 + 1 FOO). Carole & Jacci continue to work on a new STOC membership application.

Facebook

John will be meeting with Tracey on other matters in the next few days and will discuss how STOC members can assist Tracey with the Facebook project.

Madison Area Service Club Council's Appreciation Day

The annual MASCC Olympics and fall luncheon have been combined into one event scheduled for October 10, 2012. The Board discussed whether to pay a portion of the lunch fee. With five of the seven current board members attending and STOC's operating income at a loss for the current year, it was agreed by consensus not to pay a portion of the MASCC luncheon fees this year. Jacci reported that Bonnie is working with this club which is in the process of dissolving and is encouraging several of their members to join STOC.

Annual Induction Banquet

The annual STOC Induction Banquet is scheduled for September 26 at Fitzgerald's in Middleton. Mary is working on arrangements. Cost of the event will be \$20 per member plus dessert bars. A motion was made by Carole, seconded by Gene, and passed, that each member attending the banquet will be assessed a charge of \$12 plus \$20 for each guest. The remaining charges will be incurred by STOC and will be considered 2012-2013 expenses.

JOOI Report

Carole reported that the JOOI club held their first meeting of the year on September 10 and there were 175 students in attendance. STOC advisors for JOOI this year are Carole, Rick Conne, and Rick Thomas.

Foundation Donations

The Board members discussed various options for encouraging STOC members to make charitable donations directly to our Foundation.

The Board expressed its appreciation to Jacci for leading us to a very successful year.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 AM.


2012 Koeze Nut Fundraiser


What you need to know to sell Koeze Nuts:
